



"<sup>12</sup>And he looked this way and that way, and when he saw that there was no man, he slew the Egyptian, and hid him in the sand."




"<sup>16</sup>Now the priest of Midian had seven daughters: and they came and drew water, and filled the troughs to water their father's flock."

"<sup>21</sup>And Moses was content to dwell with the man: and he gave Moses Zipporah his daughter."




"<sup>22</sup>And she bare him a son, and he called his name Gershom: for he said, I have been a stranger in a strange land."




"Now Moses kept the flock of Jethro his father in law, the priest of Midian..."




"<sup>1</sup> . . . and he led the flock to the backside of the desert, and came to the mountain of God, even to Horeb."



"<sup>21</sup>And I will give this people favour in the sight of the Egyptians: and it shall come to pass, that, when ye go, ye shall not go empty."






"<sup>11</sup>And the LORD said unto him,


"<sup>24</sup>And it came to pass by the way in the inn, that the LORD met him, and sought to kill him."

Many details are omitted from this dramatic account. All we know is that Moses had failed to circumcise his son and God was angry. Evidently their first son, Gershom, was already circumcised because only one son was referenced.



"<sup>25</sup>Then Zipporah took a sharp stone, and cut off the foreskin of her son, and cast it at his feet, and said, Surely a bloody husband art thou to me."


Exodus 18:2 tells us Moses sent Zipporah back to her father.



"<sup>27</sup>And the LORD said to Aaron, Go into the wilderness to meet Moses. And he went, and met him in the mount of God, and kissed him. <sup>28</sup>And Moses told Aaron all the words of the LORD who had sent him, and all the signs which he had commanded him."



"<sup>29</sup>And Moses and Aaron went and gathered together all the elders of the children of Israel: <sup>30</sup>And Aaron spake all the words which the LORD had spoken unto Moses, and did the signs in the sight of the people."
