# MOSES HONORED THE DYING REQUEST OF JOSEPH

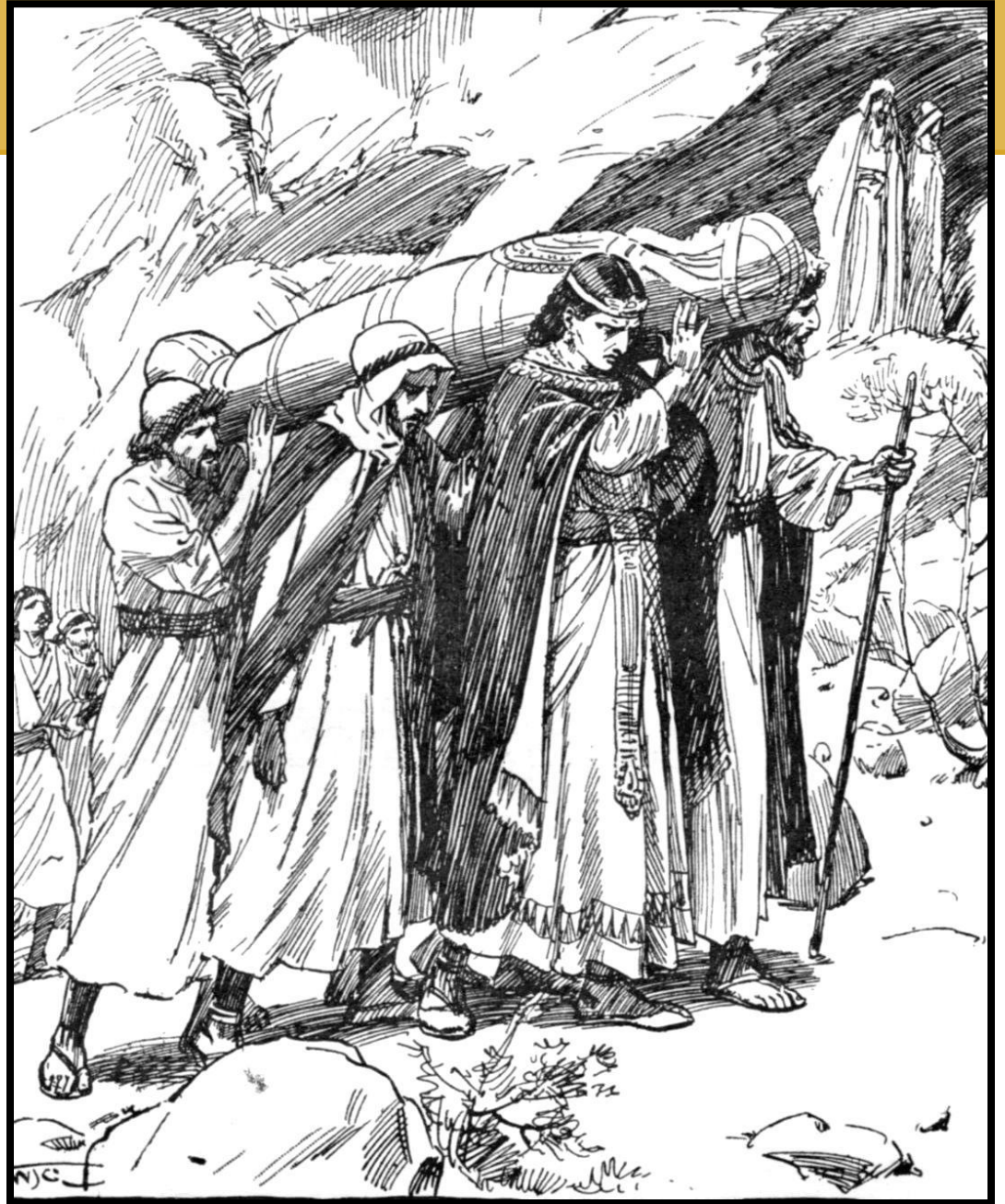
## Genesis 50:25-26

“And Joseph took an oath of the children of Israel, saying, God will surely visit you, and ye shall carry up my bones from hence. So, Joseph died, being an hundred and ten years old: and they embalmed him, and he was put in a coffin in Egypt.”





The Israelites preserved Joseph's body all the years that they were slaves in Egypt and in their exodus they carried his bones with them to honor his dying request centuries before.



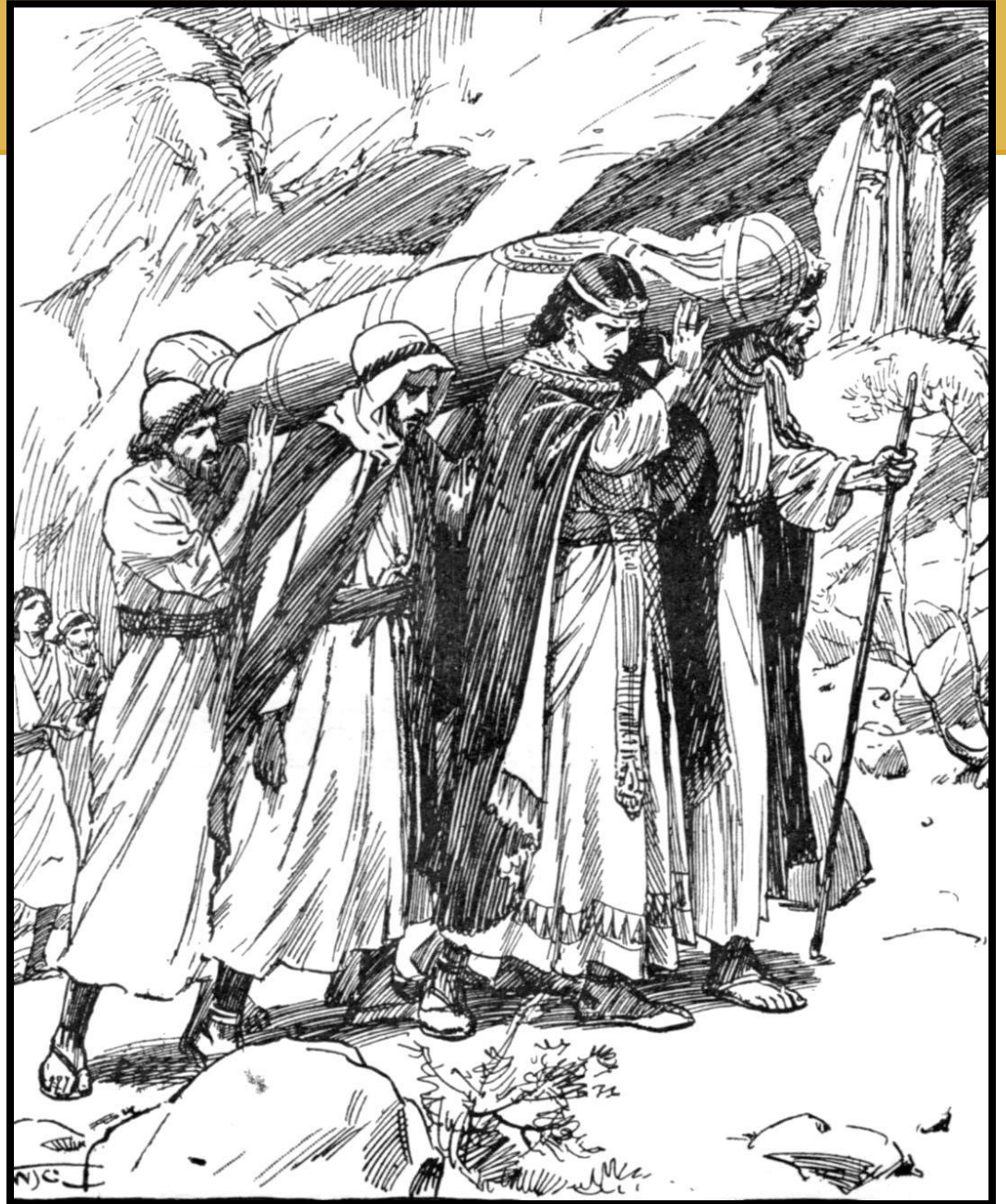
They carried his bones

Conquered the Land

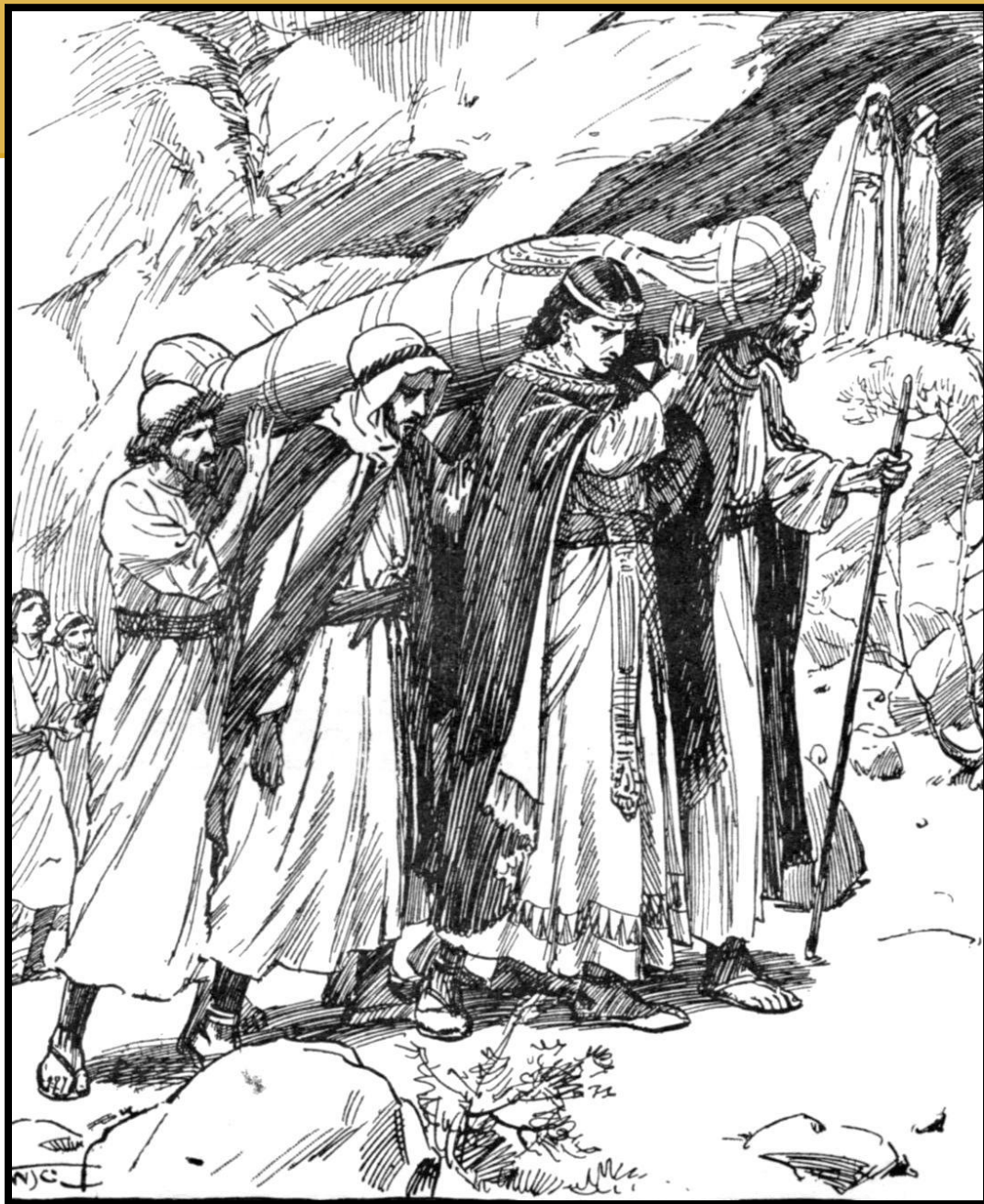




The fulfillment of the land promise was commemorated by burying the ancient bones of Joseph in a parcel of ground that had been purchased hundreds of years before by his father, Jacob.

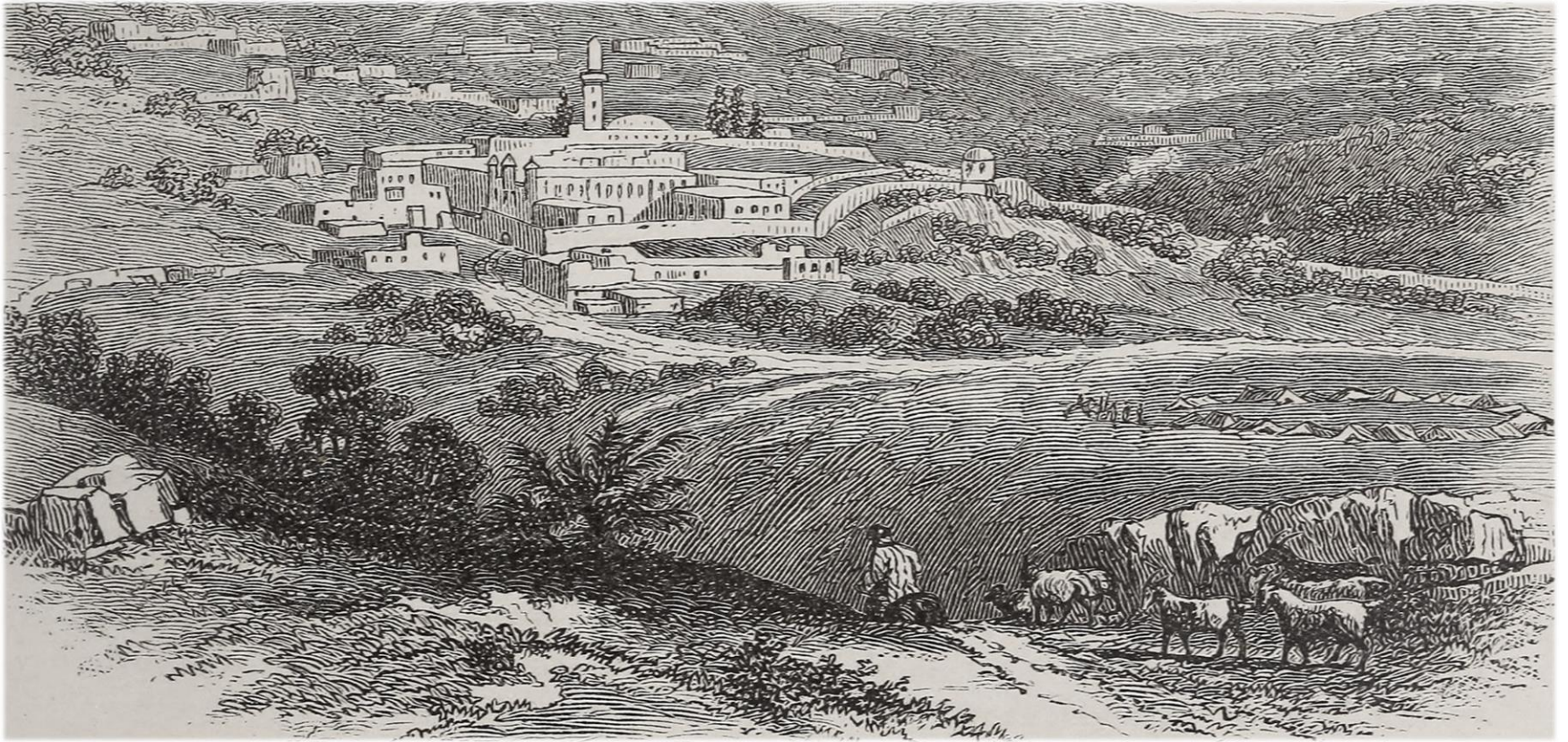
Joshua 24

“<sup>32</sup>And **the bones of Joseph**, which the children of Israel brought up out of Egypt, buried they in **Shechem**, in a parcel of ground which Jacob bought of the sons of Hamor.”





Shechem, in the center of the land, was between Mount Ebal and Mount Gerizim in a beautiful valley where Abraham, hundreds of years before, had erected his first altar in Canaan. Here Joshua in solemn ceremony read the Book of the Law to the people, (Dehoff's Bible Handbook, p. 65).



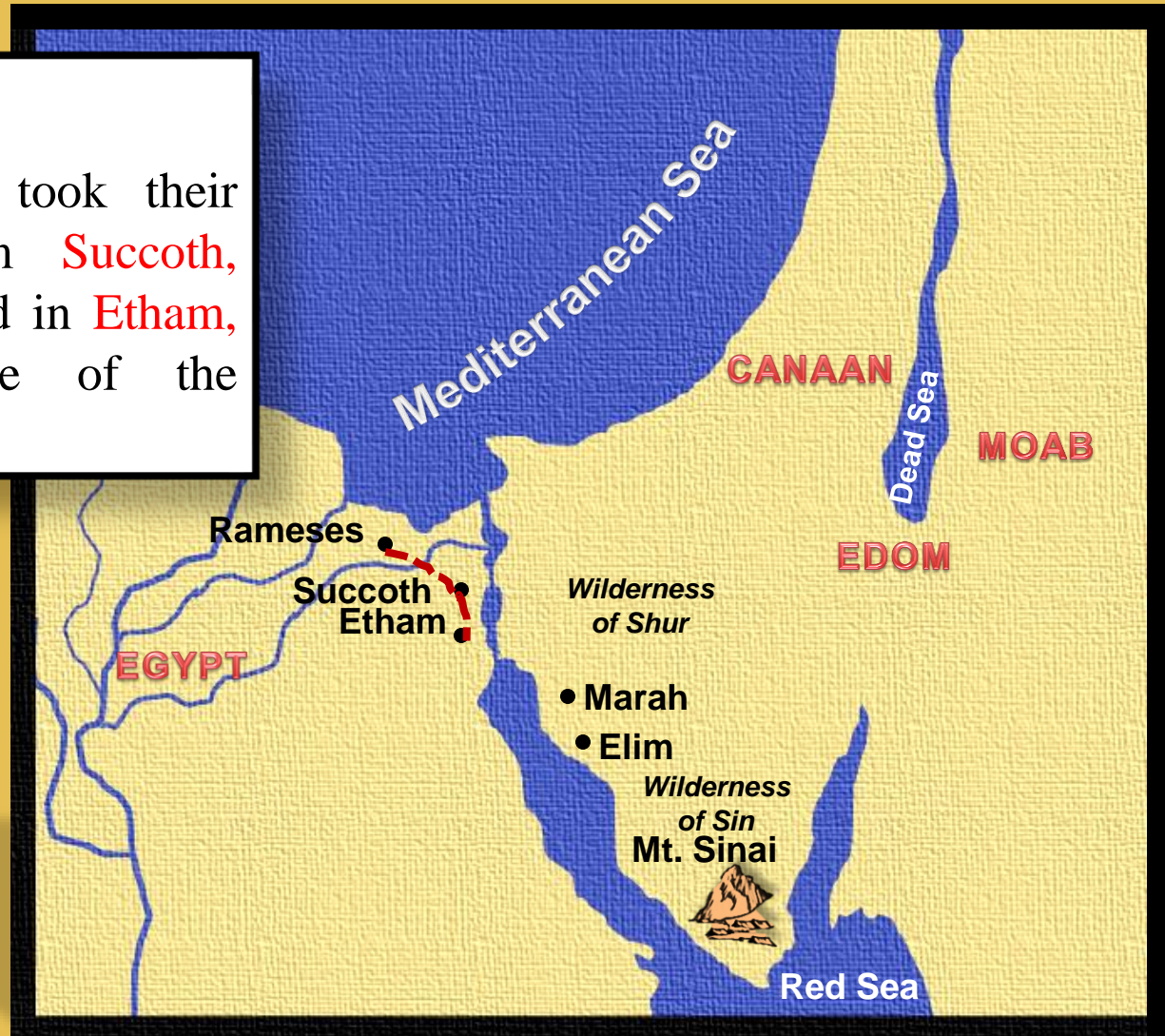

“<sup>20</sup>And they took their journey from **Succoth**, and encamped in **Etham**, in the edge of the wilderness.”

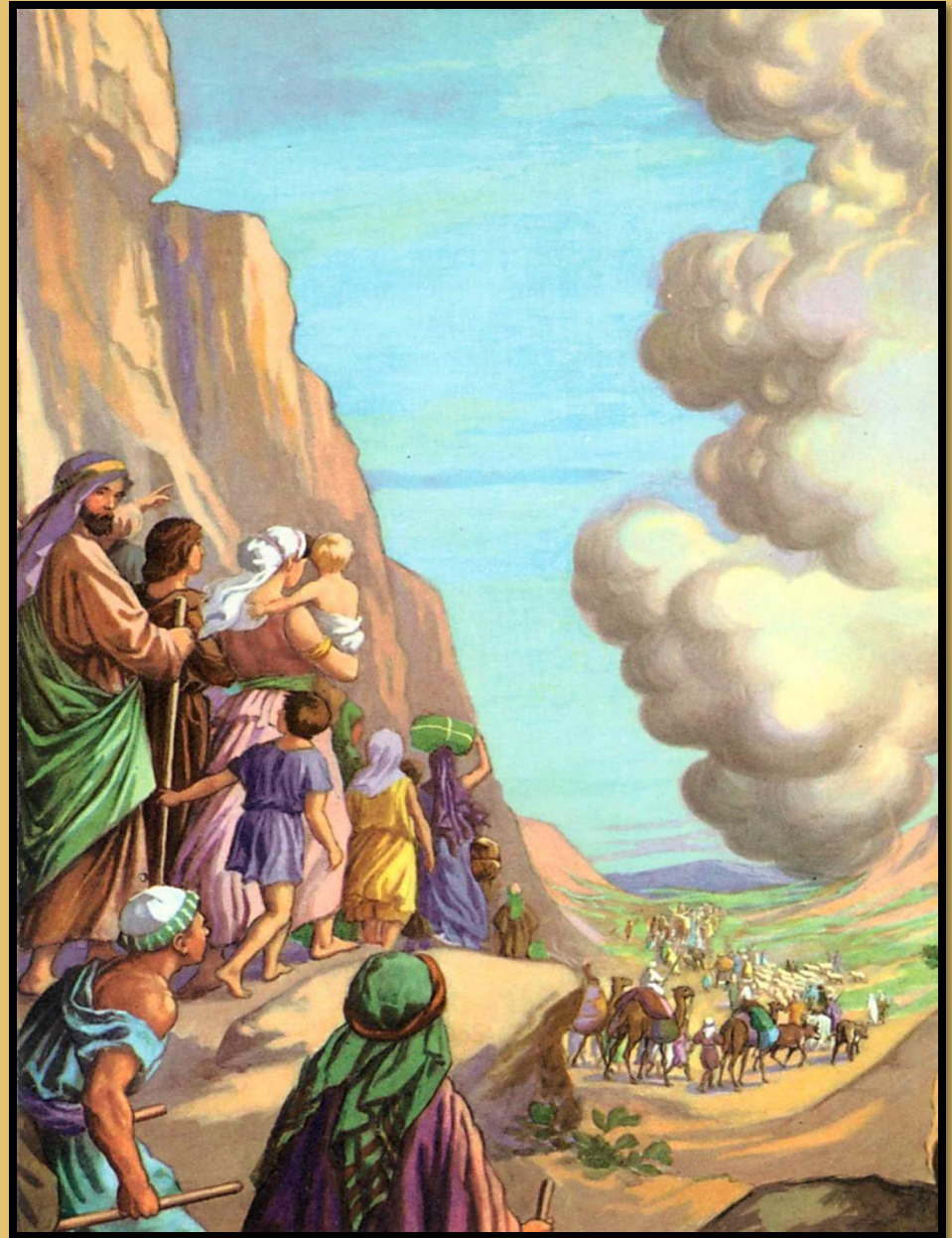




## Exodus 13

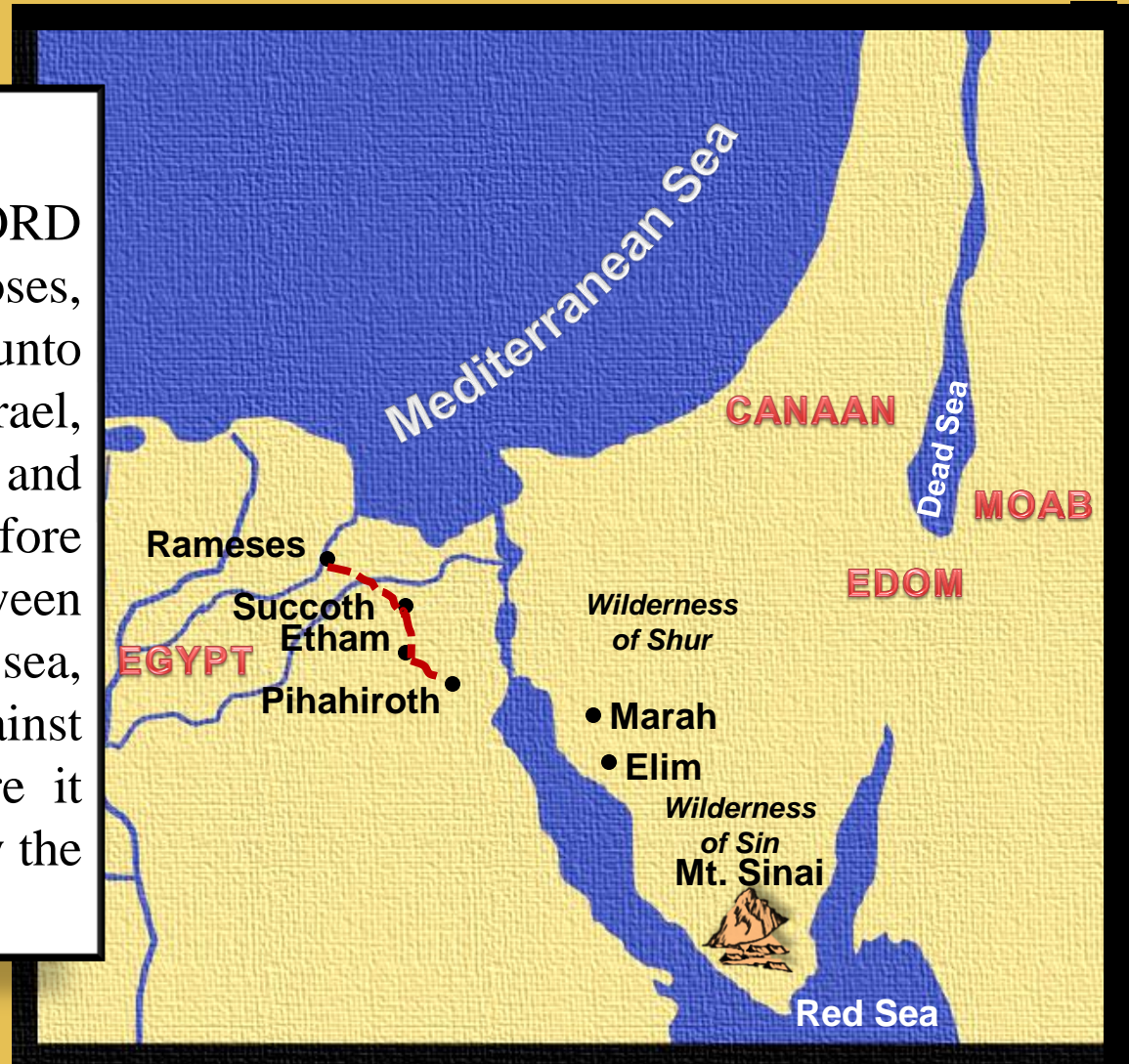

## Exodus 14

“<sup>1</sup>And the LORD spake unto Moses, saying, <sup>2</sup>Speak unto the children of Israel, that they turn and encamp before **Pihahiroth**, between Migdol and the sea, over against Baalzephon: before it shall ye encamp by the sea.”





## Exodus 14

“<sup>3</sup>For Pharaoh will say of the children of Israel, They are entangled in the land, the wilderness hath shut them in. <sup>4</sup>And **I will harden Pharaoh’s heart, that he shall follow after them**; and I will be honoured upon Pharaoh, and upon all his host; that the Egyptians may know that I am the LORD. And they did so.”





## Exodus 14

“<sup>5</sup>And it was told the king of Egypt that the people fled: and the heart of Pharaoh and of his servants was turned against the people, and they said, **Why have we done this**, that we have let Israel go from serving us? <sup>6</sup>And **he made ready his chariot, and took his people with him.**”

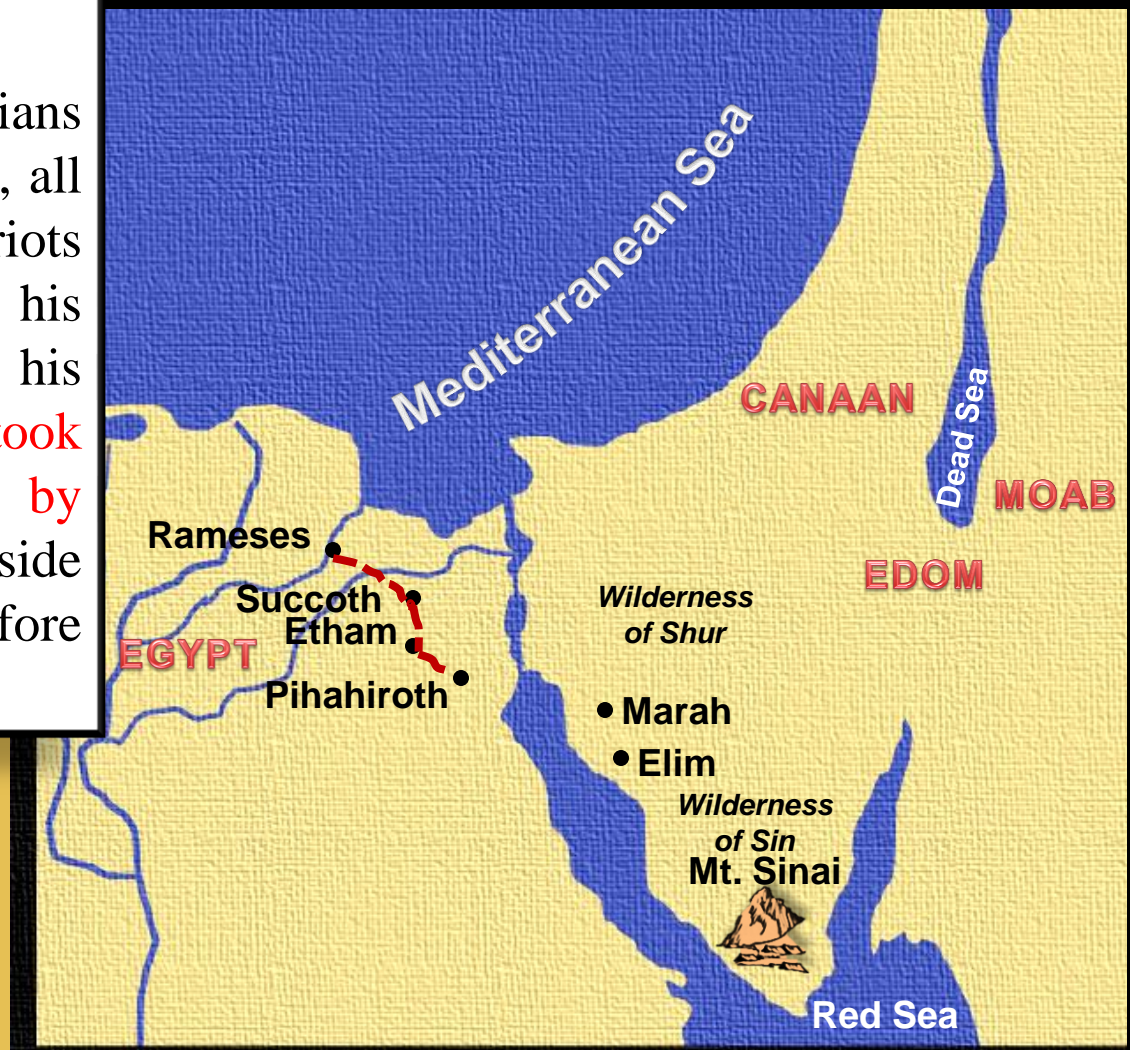
“<sup>7</sup>And he took **six hundred chosen chariots**, and all the chariots of Egypt, and captains over every one of them. <sup>8</sup>And the LORD hardened the heart of Pharaoh king of Egypt, and he pursued after the children of Israel: and the children of Israel went out with an high hand.”

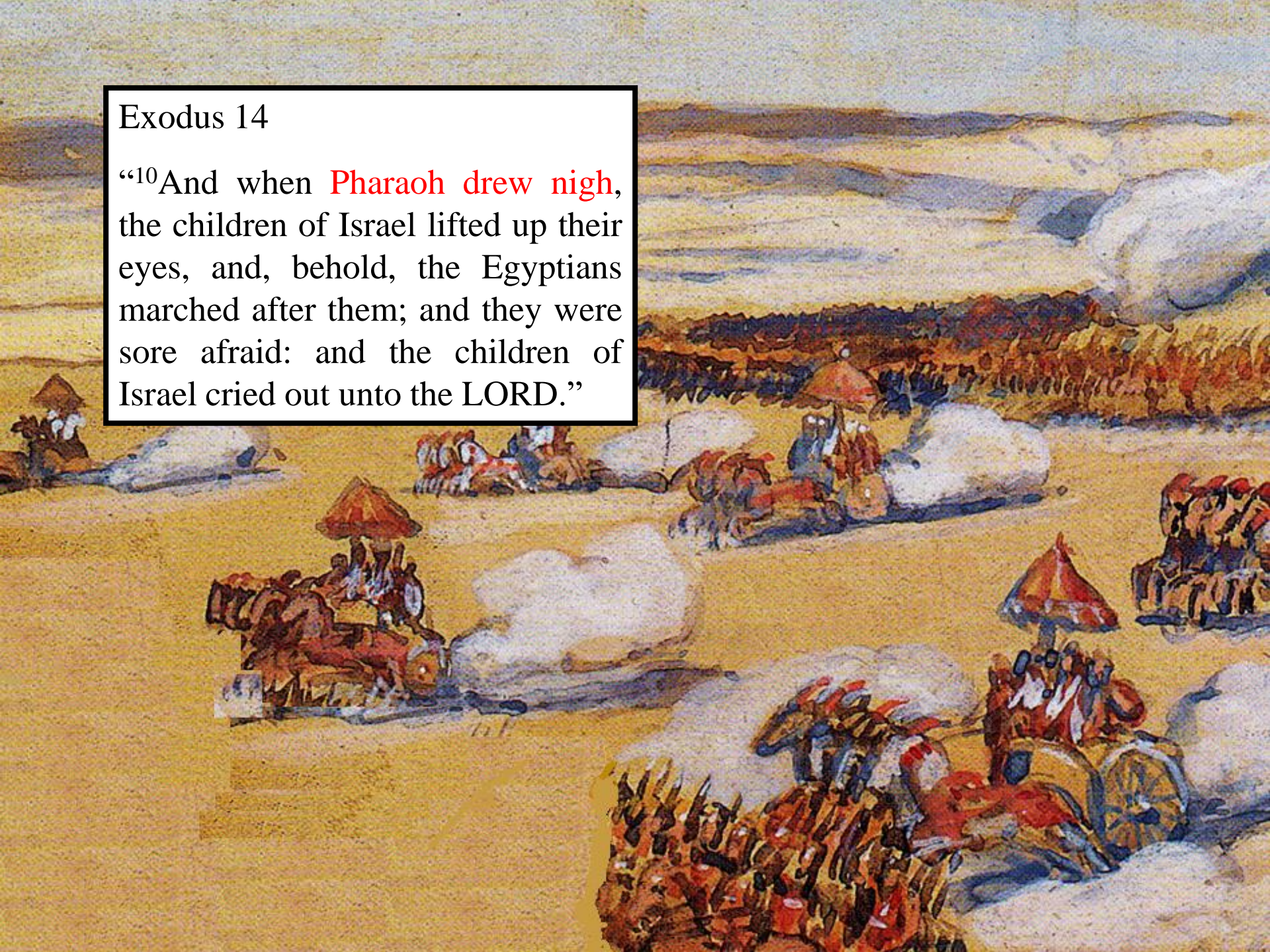
“<sup>9</sup>But the Egyptians pursued after them, all the horses and chariots of Pharaoh, and his horsemen, and his army, and **overtook them encamping by the sea,** beside Pihahiroth, before Baalzephon.”

“<sup>10</sup>And when Pharaoh drew nigh, the children of Israel lifted up their eyes, and, behold, the Egyptians marched after them; and they were sore afraid: and the children of Israel cried out unto the LORD.”

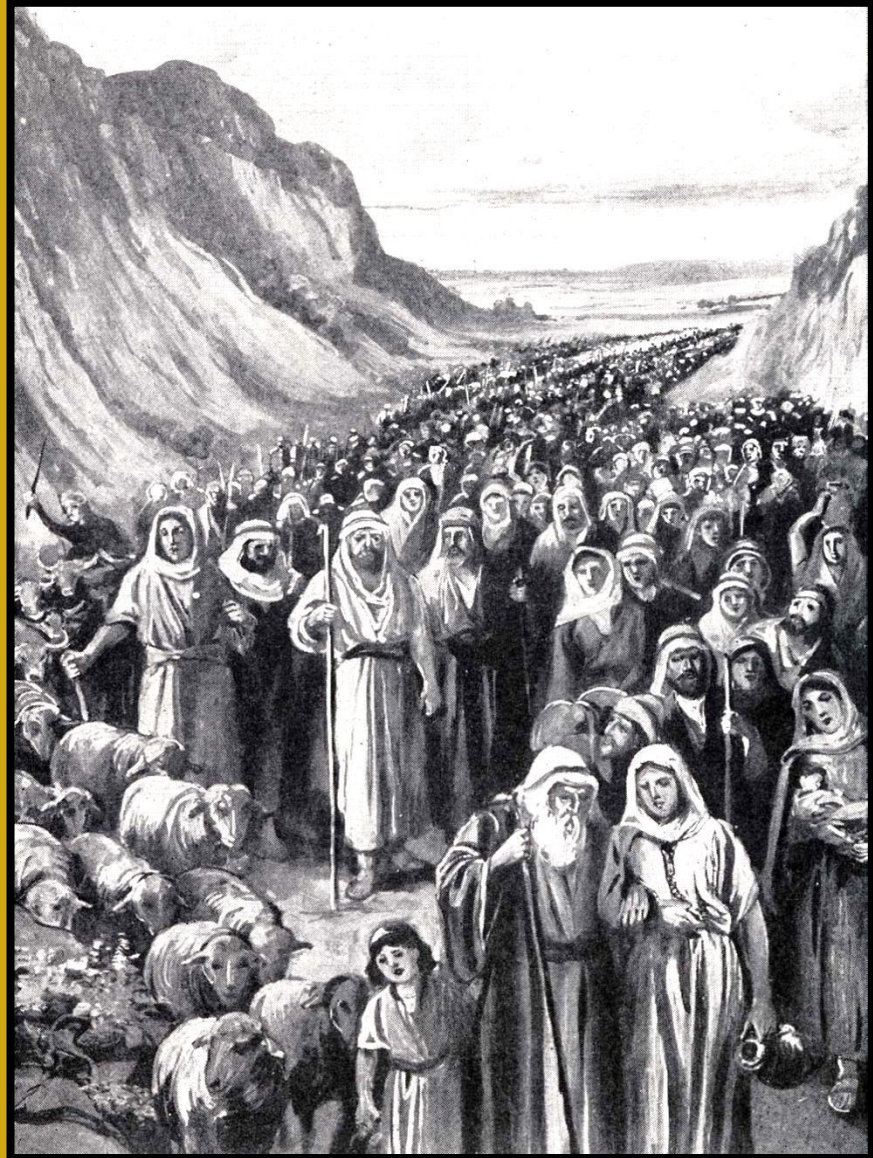




## Exodus 14

“<sup>11</sup>And they said unto Moses, Because there were no graves in Egypt, hast thou **taken us away to die in the wilderness?** wherefore hast thou dealt thus with us, to carry us forth out of Egypt?”

<sup>12</sup>Is not this the word that we did tell thee in Egypt, saying, Let us alone, that we may serve the Egyptians? For it had been better for us to serve the Egyptians, than that we should die in the wilderness.”

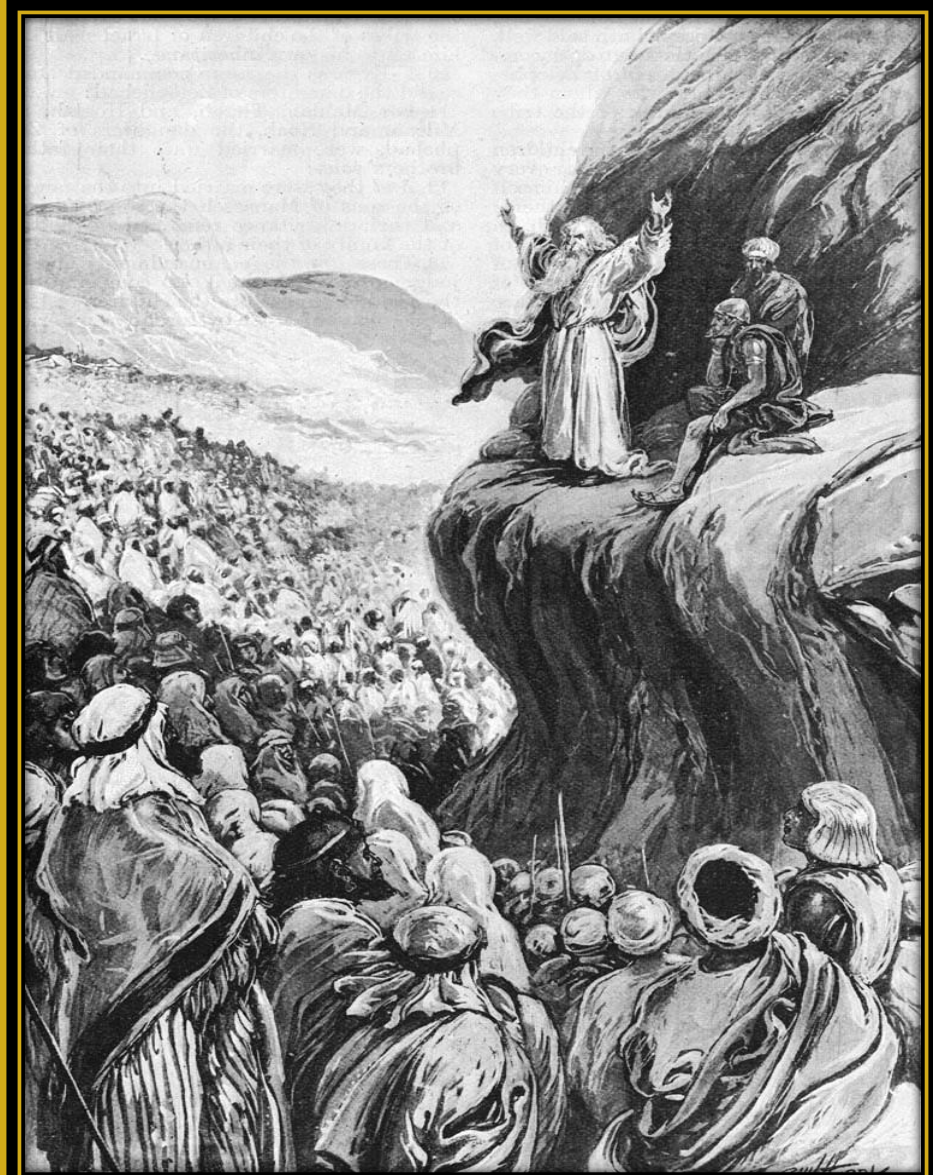




## Exodus 14

“<sup>13</sup>And Moses said unto the people, Fear ye not, stand still, and see the salvation of the LORD, which he will shew to you to day: for the Egyptians whom ye have seen to day, ye shall see them again no more for ever.

<sup>14</sup>**The LORD shall fight for you,** and ye shall hold your peace.”

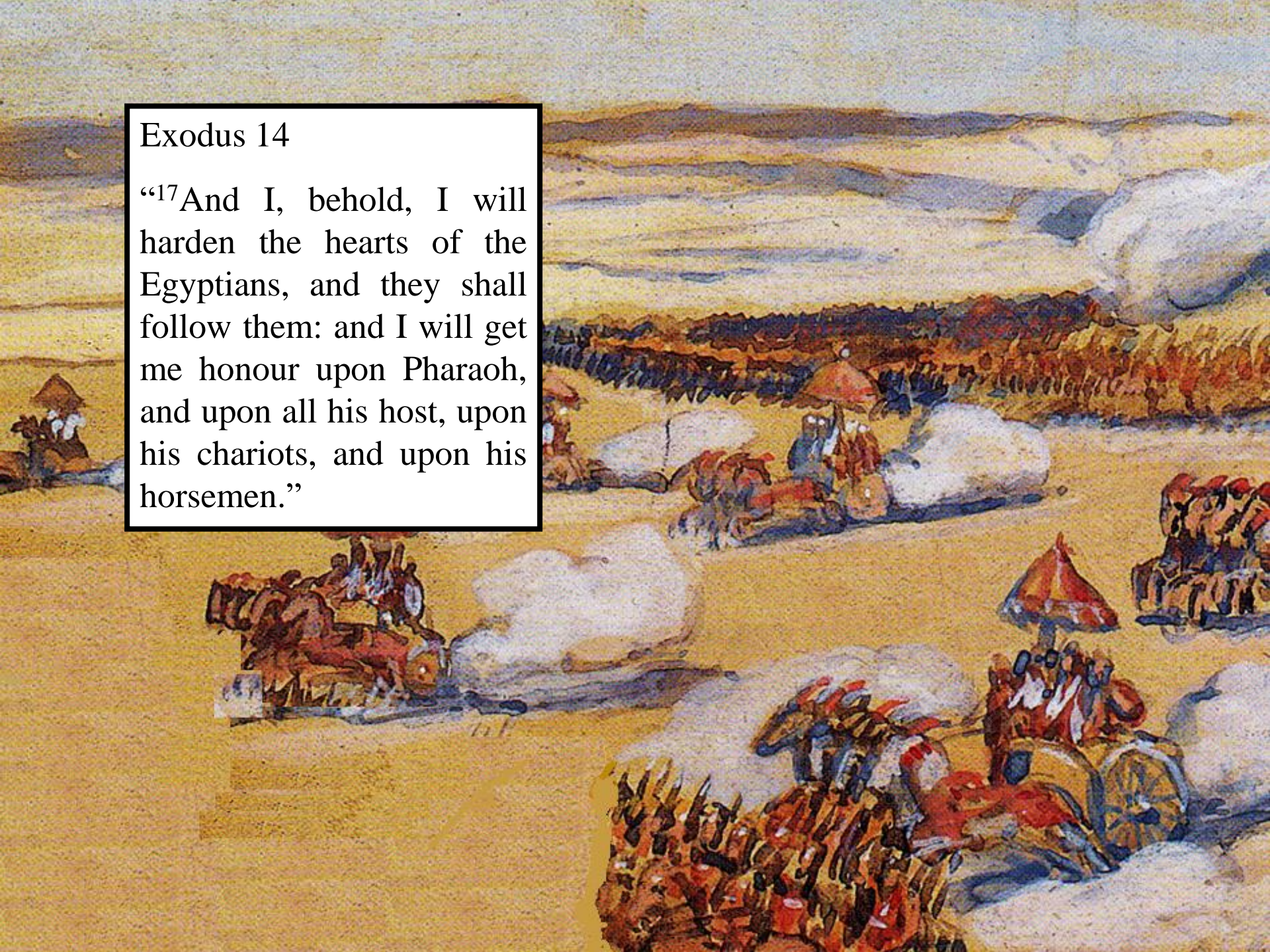

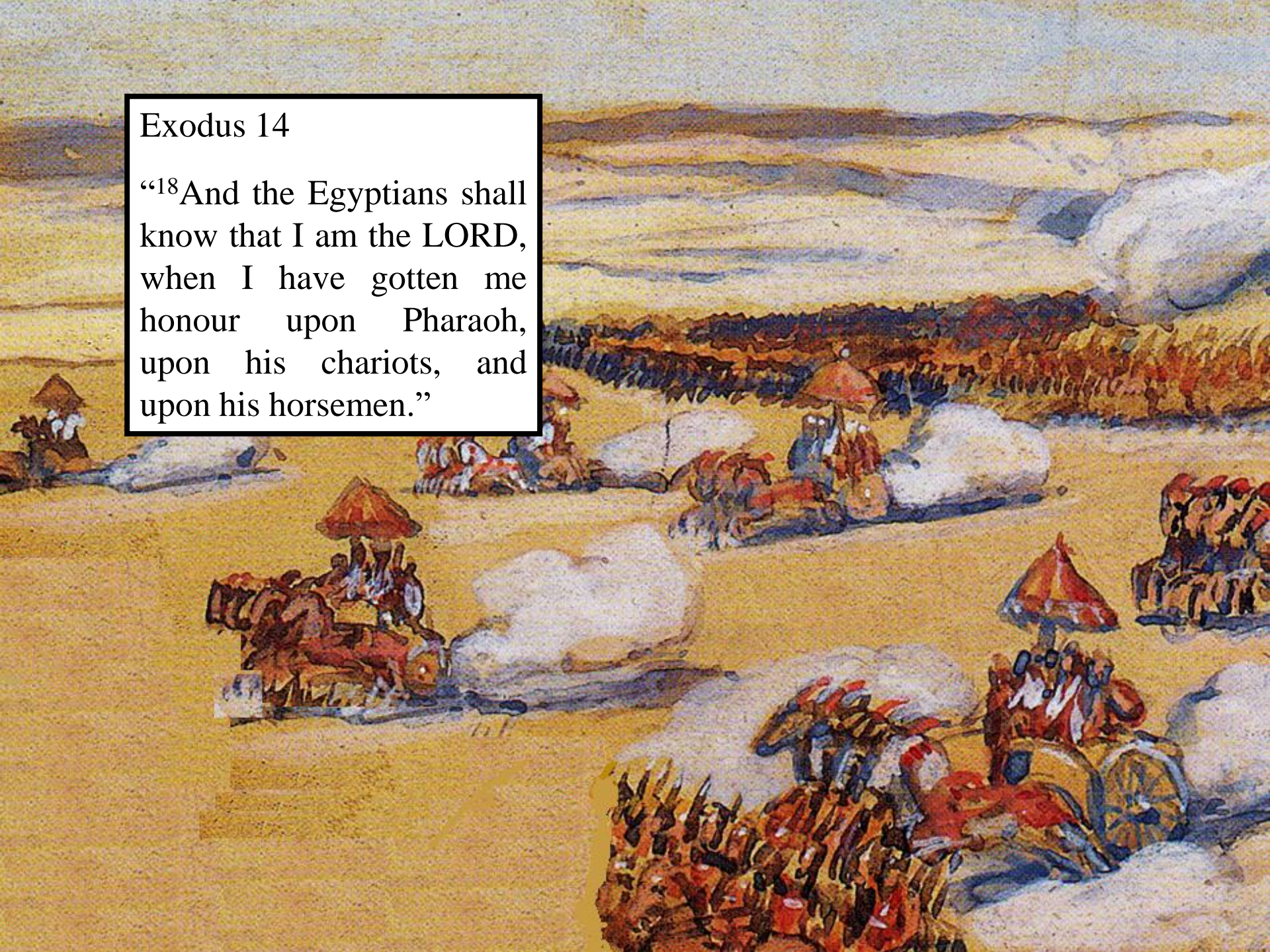

## Exodus 14

“<sup>19</sup>And the angel of God, which went before the camp of Israel, removed and went behind them; and the pillar of the cloud went from before their face, and stood behind them: <sup>20</sup>And it came between the camp of the Egyptians and the camp of Israel; and **it was a cloud and darkness** to them, but it gave light by night to these: so that the one came not near the other all the night.”



## Exodus 14

“<sup>21</sup>And Moses stretched out his hand over the sea; and the LORD caused the sea to go back by a strong east wind all that **night**, and made the sea dry land, and the waters were divided.”





It was night when they crossed the Red Sea. The angel's cloud was dark on the side of the Egyptians and light on the side of the Israelites. The cloud lighted the way for God's people as they crossed the sea that night.

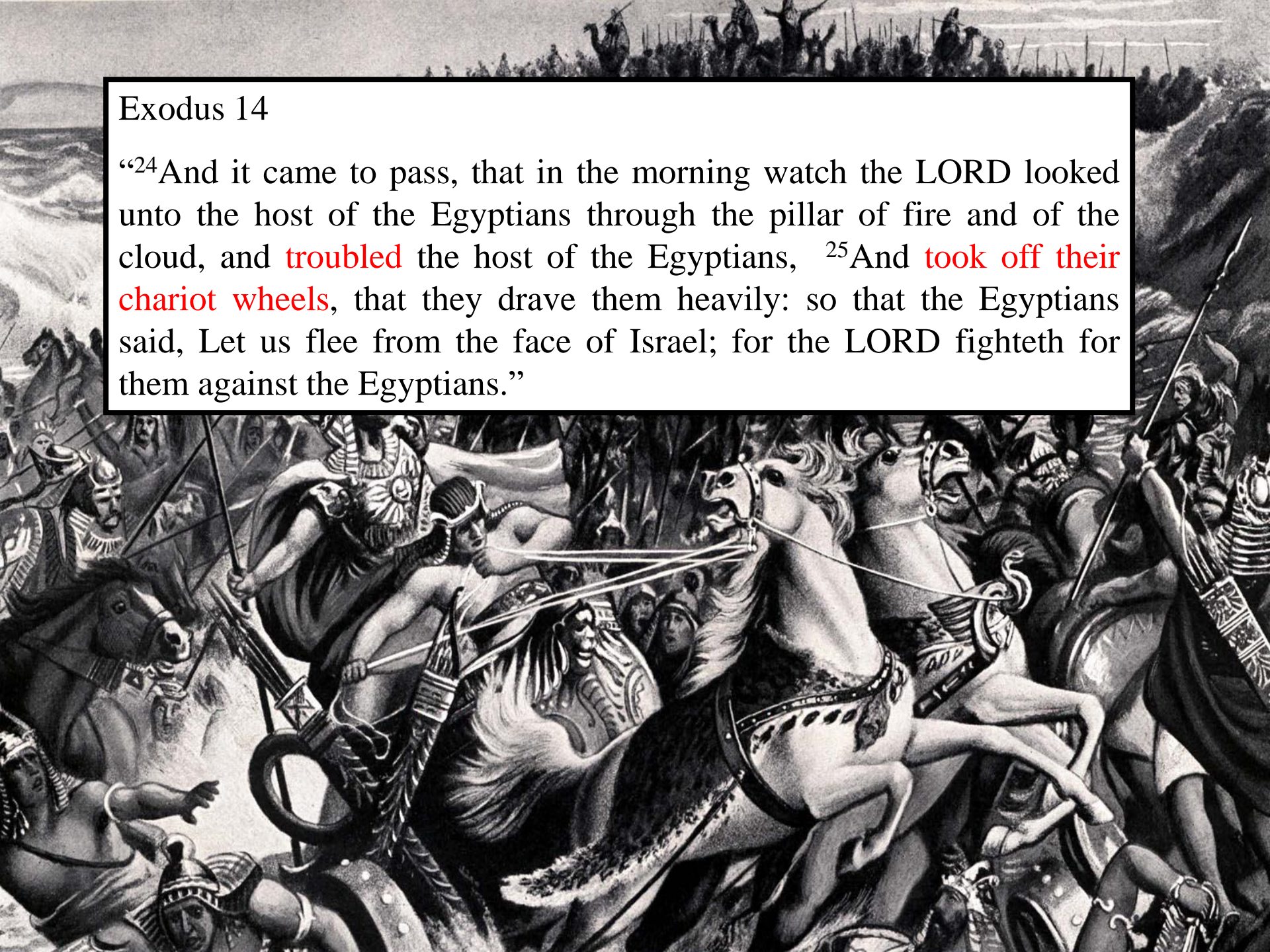

## Exodus 14

“<sup>24</sup>And it came to pass, that in the morning watch the LORD looked unto the host of the Egyptians through the pillar of fire and of the cloud, and **troubled** the host of the Egyptians, <sup>25</sup>And **took off their chariot wheels**, that they drave them heavily: so that the Egyptians said, Let us flee from the face of Israel; for the LORD fighteth for them against the Egyptians.”

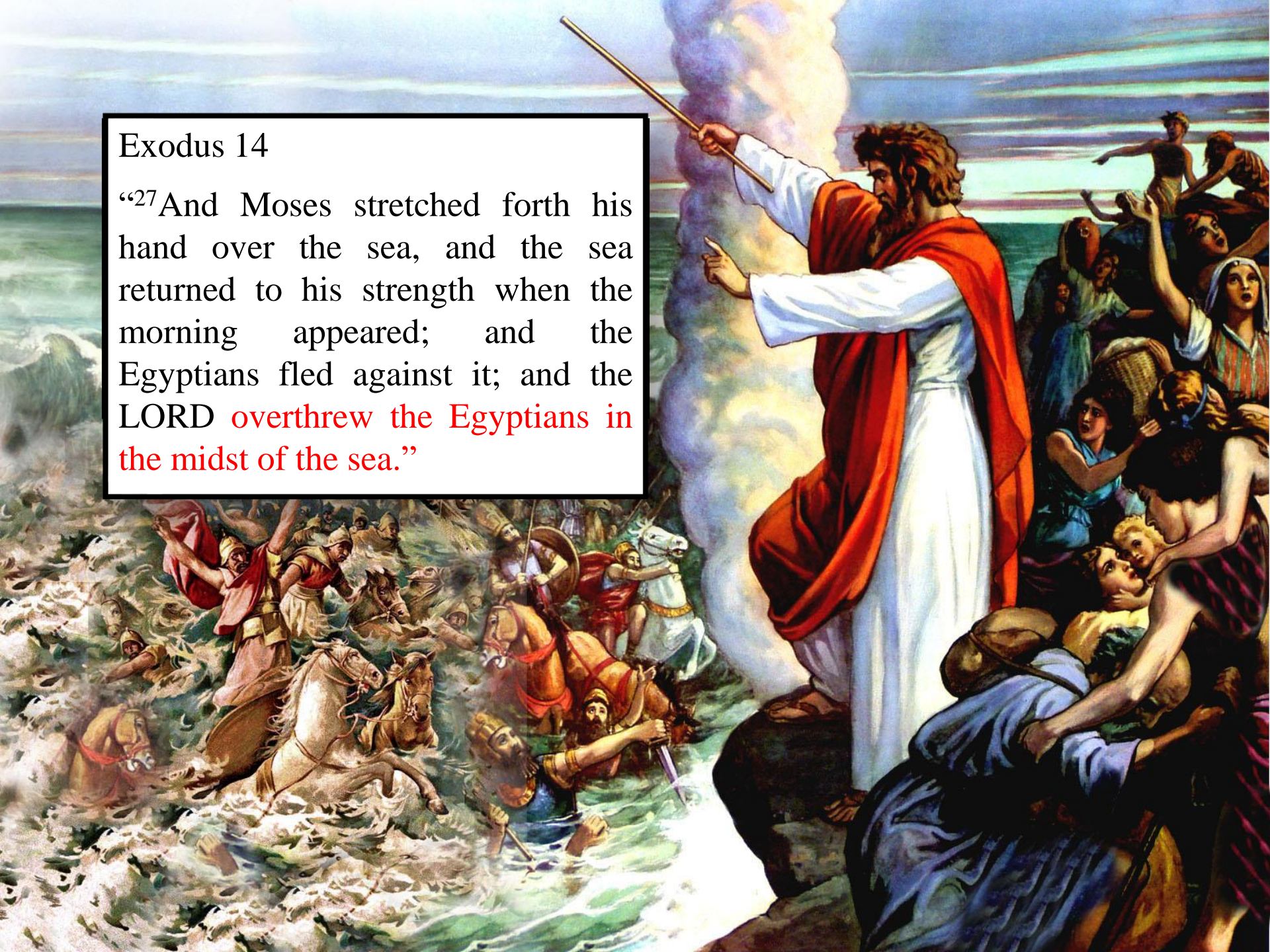

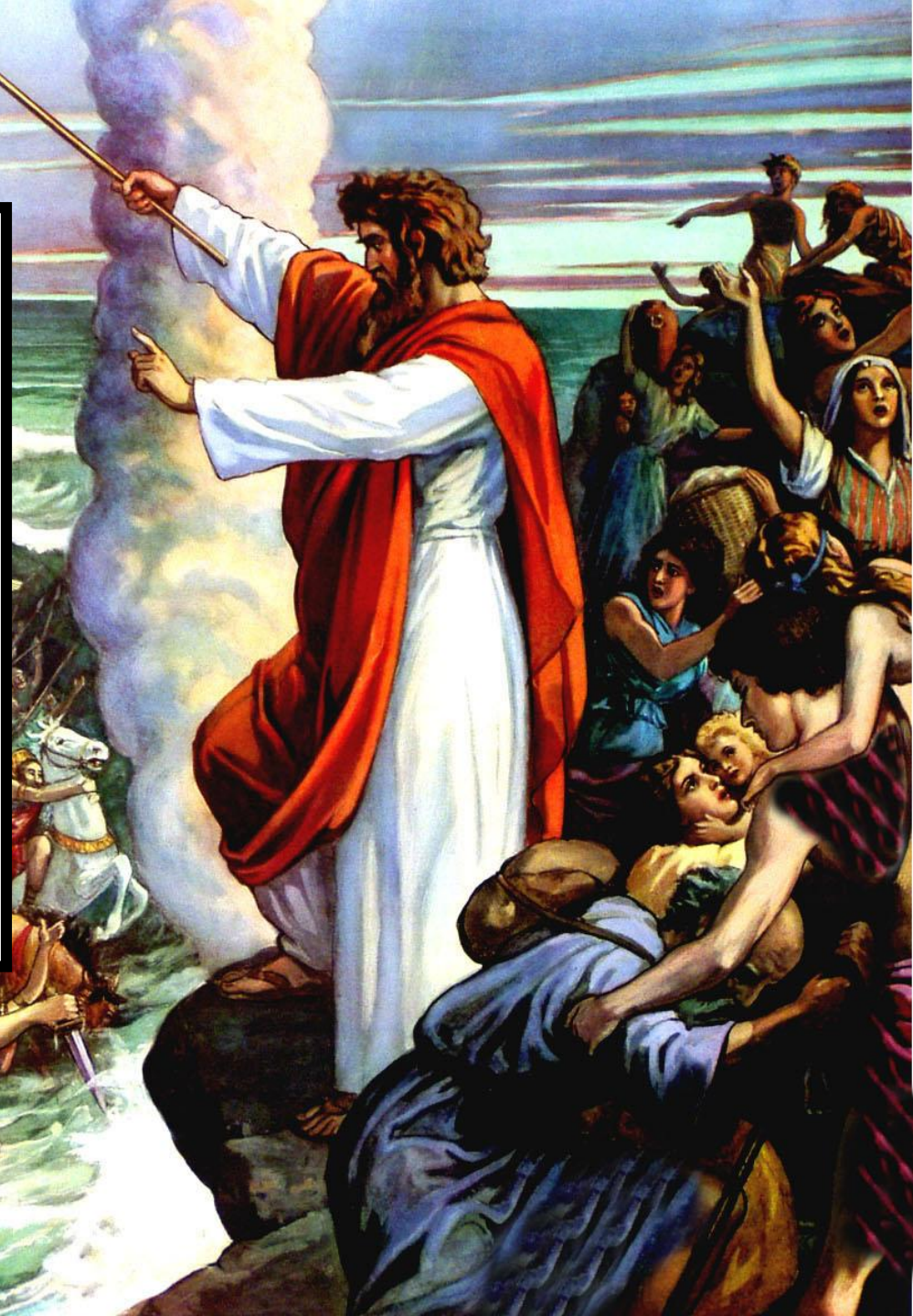




## Exodus 14

<sup>29</sup> But the children of Israel walked upon dry land in the midst of the sea; and the waters were a wall unto them on their right hand, and on their left.”

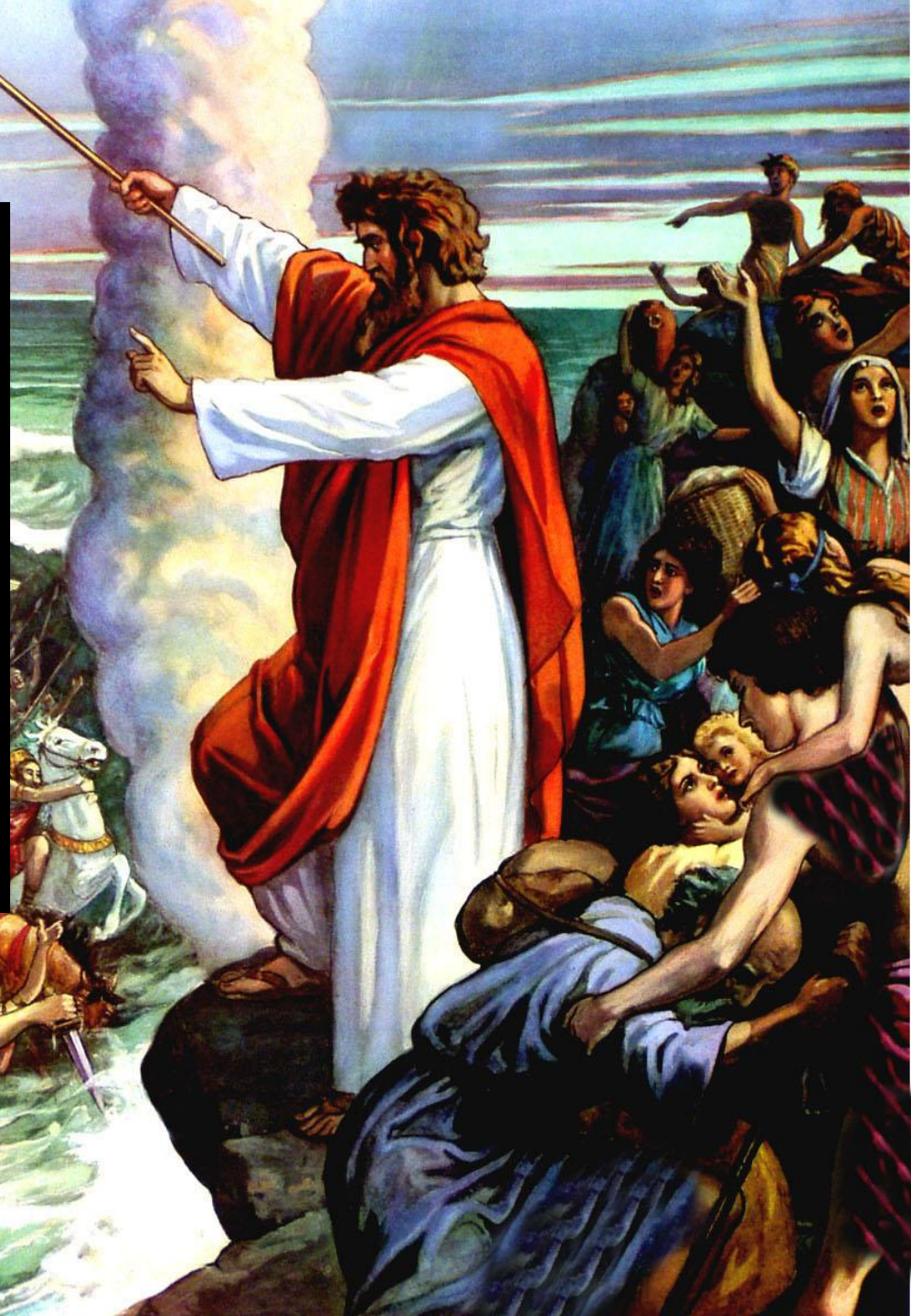




## Exodus 14

“<sup>30</sup>Thus the LORD saved Israel that day out of the hand of the Egyptians; and Israel saw the Egyptians dead upon the sea shore.

<sup>31</sup>And Israel saw that great work which the LORD did upon the Egyptians: and the people feared the LORD, and believed the LORD, and his servant Moses.”
