


EXODUS Chapters 32-34

They saw God's presence on Sinai


Yet they forsook Him when the presence of Moses was absent.






"²And Aaron said unto them,

Break off the golden earrings, which are in the ears of your wives, of your sons, and of your daughters, and bring them unto me."




These be thy gods, O Israel, which brought thee up out of the land of Egypt."






"9 And the LORD said unto Moses,

nation."




Moses pleaded with God to spare the Israelites.

God set aside his righteous anger.






"¹⁷And when Joshua heard the noise of the people as they shouted, he said unto Moses, There is a noise of war in the camp. ¹⁸And he said,


> It is not the voice of them that shout for mastery, neither is it the voice of them that cry for being overcome: but the noise of them that sing do I hear."



²⁰And he took the calf which they had made, and burnt it in the fire, and ground it to powder, and strawed it upon the water, and made the children of Israel drink of it."









"27 And he said unto them,

"²⁸And the children of Levi did according to the word of Moses: and there fell of the people that day about **three thousand** men."







"29For Moses had said,


Consecrate yourselves to day to the LORD, even every man upon his son, and upon his brother; that he may bestow upon you a blessing this day.

Whosoever hath sinned against me, him will I blot out of my book.






EXODUS Chapter 33


Exodus 33:1-6 "And the LORD said unto Moses, Depart, and go up hence, thou and the people which thou hast brought up out of the land of Egypt, unto the land which I sware unto Abraham, to Isaac, and to Jacob, saying, Unto thy seed will I give it: ²And I will send an angel before thee; and I will drive out the Canaanite, the Amorite, and the Hittite, and the Perizzite, the Hivite, and the Jebusite: ³Unto a land flowing with milk and honey: for I will not go up in the midst of thee; for thou art a stiffnecked people: lest I consume thee in the way. ⁴And when the people heard these evil tidings, they mourned: and no man did put on him his ornaments. ⁵For the LORD had said unto Moses, Say unto the children of Israel, Ye are a stiffnecked people: I will come up into the midst of thee in a moment, and consume thee: therefore now put off thy ornaments from thee, that I may know what to do unto thee. ⁶And the children of Israel stripped themselves of their ornaments by the mount Horeb."






"With him will I speak mouth to mouth, even apparently, and not in dark speeches; and the **similitude** of the LORD shall he behold."


Moses mediated between God and Israel.


