


Emerson Jewel Estes

1903 - 2000



Emerson J. Estes was born June 17, 1903, in Tippah County, Mississippi. He attended the schools of his day, and later he studied at the Montgomery Bible

College (which is now Faulkner University), in Montgomery, Alabama. However, his formal training was only a part of his education. He was a manager of an insurance company, and worked in the funeral business, but most impressively he was a “giant” among the preachers and leaders of this generation.

Brother Estes became a Christian in 1923. He has now preached for sixty-four years. From the time of his first sermon until the present, he has preached “The Old Jerusalem Gospel” in a most effective manner.

He has preached the gospel to thousands and he has converted hundreds of people to Christ. He has preached in twenty-five states, Canada, and the Bahamas. The phenomenal success of his preaching can be explained only on the ground that his sermons are sound, fearless and scriptural. Through the years, he has been in great demand and seldom has one man preached to so many over such a long period of time. Brother Estes preaches “Jesus Christ, and him crucified” (1 Cor. 2:2). He knows that the gospel of Christ “is the power of God unto salvation” (Rom. 1:16). Therefore, he follows the instructions of the inspired apostle Paul to “Preach the word” (2 Tim. 4:2).

His command of the English language is marvelous indeed. His preaching is simple, yet profound. He opposes with all of his being those who would seek to corrupt minds, “from the simplicity and the

purity that is toward Christ” (2 Cor. 11:3). He always preaches the truth. He both knows and believes the following Scripture: “For though I preach the gospel, I have nothing to glory of: for necessity is laid upon me; yea, woe is unto me, if I preach not the gospel!” (1 Cor. 9:16). He does not pervert the gospel of Christ, for he is well aware that those who do so, will bring a curse upon themselves (1 Cor. 9:16; Gal. 1:89).

Brother Estes has served as one of the Board of Directors for Montgomery Bible College, Childhaven Orphanage, and MidSouth Christian Nursing Home. In 1983, he was made an honorary Lt. Colonel on the staff of George Wallace, then the governor of Alabama. For years, he wrote articles for newspapers, and he also published a gospel paper entitled Way of Life for a period of four years.

He did his first full time preaching in Birmingham and followed that with preaching in Montgomery, Alabama. He subsequently became the first full time evangelist of the Getwell Church of Christ in Memphis, Tennessee, in which capacity he served for eight years. While working with Getwell, he began the Truth In Love radio program on WHBQ. This program is likely the oldest continuous radio program in the area. During his years as speaker, he received and answered hundreds, perhaps even thousands of questions about the Bible and what it teaches. On more than one occasion, he invited preachers who opposed what the Bible teaches to

appear on his program. He allowed them to state their views, and then kindly, gently, but firmly, refuted their error. He conducted one of the most unique, interesting, and informative radio programs to which I ever listened and perhaps, one of the most unusual, and distinctive ever aired. Tremendous good resulted from brother Estes' radio work.

Emerson J. Estes is of the "Old School" of evangelists. He believes the Bible and preaches it. Like William Jennings Bryan, he is "a silver tongued orator," though he moves his audience to obedience, and action, through a sincere, fervent, earnest appeal to the Scriptures. He speaks "as the oracles of God" (1 Pet. 4:11). Sometimes reference is made to "a southern gentleman." Brother Estes symbolizes that description, but more importantly he epitomizes a truly great "Christian gentleman." His physical appearance is striking and commanding. He stands as erect as an arrow. His beautiful grey hair immediately attracts one's attention. He has a wonderful sense of humor, and though he was ninety years old on June 17, 1993, his mind is alert, quick and active. This remarkable man still serves as the full time evangelist for the Merton Street Church of Christ in Memphis, Tennessee, and this he had done for many years. He also serves as one of the elders of the congregation.

Emerson J. Estes has been married for sixty-five years to Mildred Sams Estes. Through the years she has stood by his side, and has truly been a great

“help meet.” Their two lovely daughters are: Mrs. Sylvia Estes Harville of Memphis, Tennessee, and Mrs. Wanda Estes Kindred of Burlington, Kentucky. Brother and sister Estes have three grandchildren.

When David was giving his final charge to Solomon he said, “Be thou strong therefore, and show thyself a man” (1 Kin. 2:2). The Poet wrote: Lives of great men remind us we can make our lives sublime, And departing leave behind us footprints on the sands of time.

The life of brother Emerson J. Estes is a most excellent example of the foregoing beautiful sentiments. Men of his type and character are far too few. We are made to wonder whether those of fewer years will measure up to the high standard set by his kind. To fail to appreciate such men while they live, and to perpetuate their memory after they are gone, would be an injustice, not only to such men, but to many yet unborn who may be encouraged and motivated by reading the stories of their lives. Emerson J. Estes is one of those great men, and it is our great, and exalted privilege to give, “honor to whom honor” is due (Rom. 13:7)!

SPIRITUAL PLANNING

INTRODUCTION

- The Lord declared that men ought to plan the building of towers, Lk. 14:28-29.

- Solomon said where there is no wise guidance the people falleth, Prov. 11:14.
- Jeremiah said, “Cursed be he that doeth the work of the Lord negligently, Jer. 48:10.

The church is too wonderful, souls too valuable and eternity too long to be left to slipshod tactics or haphazard chance. It is far better to plan something and fail than to plan nothing and succeed. If a business plans ahead because there are millions of dollars involved, we must plan even more carefully because there are millions of souls involved. Where there is no planning, Christians will be lukewarm, indifferent, confused and every vile deed.

Plans by vision and faith

Plans that will awaken the church to a gracious liberality, will take the form of a **budget**. A **budget** is an estimate of probable income and expenses for a given period, with proposals for maintaining a proper balance between two totals.

It is a means of doing the Lord’s work sensibly and in order (I Cor. 14:40).

A FALSE CONCEPT OF GOD

I Kings 20:28

INTRODUCTION

The Syrians thought of God as their idolatrous God. They had various gods for various areas of their life—one for hills, one for valleys.

ILLUSTRATION

The Japanese have two gods; one to whom they pray for blessings in this life and another for blessings after death.

The Syrians thought that God was limited to helping the Israelites only in the mountains. Therefore they sought to fight the Israelites in the valleys. The misconception of God by the Syrians led to their defeat.

What about our conception of God? Do we think of God in certain areas of our life and not in others? Do we limit God to certain circumstances and places in our life?

Is God a God of the valleys as well as the hills?

Is the God of Abraham and Isaac and Paul our God?

It is true that their God performed miracles in previous dispensations, but He is still the same God though there are no miracles today. When we think of God, do we really believe that he will do for us what he did for Abraham and others? Their

faithfulness made it possible for God to bless them.
Isa. 59:2

Is our God a God of sickness but not of health?

We realize our need for God and we expect Him to help us in time of sickness but what about when we are well? Do we think of Him then and expect his aid in health?

ILLUSTRATION

I often have people send for me when they are sick and ask that I pray God's blessing on them. Yet, I have never had anyone ask me to pray that God would bless them while they are healthy and help them use their health in the right way.

Is there not more danger of my being lost while in good health than when I am sick? Most people think of God when sick but multitudes forsake Him while in good health.

“I am the Lord and I change not”
“Same yesterday, today and forever”
Many do not fear God”

DID HE MEAN IT?

Did Jesus really mean it when He said—

Mt. 5:44 “But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you.”

Mt. 7:12 “Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.”

How often have we prayed for our enemies?

Have we tried to love them?

Set your mind on God’s kingdom and His justice before everything else, and all the rest will come to you as well—

Mt. 6:33-34 “But seek ye first the kingdom of God, and his righteousness; and all these things shall be added unto you. Take therefore no thought for the morrow: for the morrow shall take thought for the things of itself. Sufficient unto the day [is] the evil thereof.”

Do we really believe that if we put God’s kingdom first the necessities of life will be provided for us without worry—

Mt. 18:21-22 “Then came Peter to him, and said, Lord, how oft shall my brother sin against me, and I forgive him? till seven times? Jesus saith unto him, I say not unto thee, Until seven times: but, Until seventy times seven.”

Does it seem to you that to forgive someone this many times is overdoing things a bit? Makes you an easy mark? Jesus didn't think so—

Jn. 13:34 “A new commandment I give unto you, That ye love one another; as I have loved you, that ye also love one another.”

Do we think loving one another is simply a good suggestion from our Lord? Look again. Christ said it is a commandment—

Most of these verses are familiar to us. We have read them time and time again through the years. Without seeing what they mean . . . we think we know so we pass over them.

FOLLOW THINGS WHICH MAKE FOR PEACE

INTRODUCTION

Rom. 14:19 “Let us therefore follow after the things which make for peace, and things wherewith one may edify another.”

Mk. 4:39 “And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.”

Jn. 7:44-46 “And some of them would have taken him; but no man laid hands on him. Then came the officers to the chief priests and Pharisees; and they said unto them, Why have ye not brought him? The officers answered, Never man spake like this man.”

Rom. 14:17 “For the kingdom of God is not meat and drink; but righteousness, and peace, and joy in the Holy Ghost.”

Rom. 14:18 “For he that in these things serveth Christ [is] acceptable to God, and approved of men.”

Let us not follow after untaught questions which gender strife. But let us seek that which brings true and lasting peace and harmony by helping and benefiting all (**I Tim. 6:4; I Pet. 3:11**).

EDIFY: Build up, intellectually, morally, and spiritually

Preaching makes for peace: **Rom. 10:15** “And how shall they preach, except they be sent? as it is

written, How beautiful are the feet of them that preach the gospel of peace, and bring glad tidings of good things!”

Kindness in speech: **Prov. 15:1-2** “A soft answer turneth away wrath: but grievous words stir up anger. The tongue of the wise useth knowledge aright: but the mouth of fools pours out foolishness.”

Golden Rule: **Mt. 7:12** “Therefore all things whatsoever ye would that men should do to you, do ye even so to them: for this is the law and the prophets.”

Our ways must please the Lord: **Prov. 16:7** “When a man's ways please the LORD, he maketh even his enemies to be at peace with him.”

There are many things which destroy peace

Sowing discord among brethren: **Prov. 6:16-19** “These six [things] doth the LORD hate: yea, seven [are] an abomination unto him: A proud look, a lying tongue, and hands that shed innocent blood, An heart that deviseth wicked imaginations, feet that be swift in running to mischief, A false witness [that] speaketh lies, and he that soweth discord among brethren.”

Meddling with the affairs of others: **I Pet. 4:15-16** “But let none of you suffer as a murderer, or [as] a thief, or [as] an evildoer, or as a busybody in other

men's matters. Yet if [any man suffer] as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on this behalf.”

Human doctrines destroy peace: **Gal. 1:6-9** “I marvel that ye are so soon removed from him that called you into the grace of Christ unto another gospel: Which is not another; but there be some that trouble you, and would pervert the gospel of Christ. But though we, or an angel from heaven, preach any other gospel unto you than that which we have preached unto you, let him be accursed. As we said before, so say I now again, If any [man] preach any other gospel unto you than that ye have received, let him be accursed.”

False teachers: **Acts 20:29-30** “For I know this, that after my departing shall grievous wolves enter in among you, not sparing the flock. Also of your own selves shall men arise, speaking perverse things, to draw away disciples after them.”

Contentious persons: **I Cor. 1:10** “Now I beseech you, brethren, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that ye all speak the same thing, and [that] there be no divisions among you; but [that] ye be perfectly joined together in the same mind and in the same judgment.”

How to have perfect peace

Let your heart be stayed / fixed on God: **Isa. 26:3**
“Thou wilt keep [him] in perfect peace, [whose]

mind [is] stayed [on thee]: because he trusteth in thee.”

Unwavering faith in God: **Rom. 15:13** “Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Ghost.”

Assurance of pardon or justification: **Rom. 5:1** “Therefore being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ:”

But Paul didn’t have peace until after he was baptized (Acts 9:9, 22:16).

So had the Romans obeyed (Rom. 5:1, 6:17).

The peace of God will keep or possess our hearts only on the conditions that we **Phil. 4:6-7** “Be careful (anxious) for nothing.”

“There is no peace saith the Lord, unto the wicked,” Isa. 48:22. Why? “The wicked shall be turned into hell, [and] all the nations that forget God,” Psa. 9:17.

DIGNITY AND STABILITY OF THE CHURCH

The church is stable and enduring because it rests upon and is made up of unchanging truth. The truth declares, defends and preserves it.

The church is the habitation of the living God

The church of God is the house of God

He is the builder

He is the owner

He is the inhabitant

God is the life of his own church

- The church lives by being faithful to the truth.
- No pains should be spared in acquiring efficiency in church work.
- Church work affords a special usefulness.
- Work for God demands the highest moral qualifications.
- Work one for the church helps the growth of personal godliness

A mountaineer in the Alps who had risked his life to save a sheep prayed, “O God, if such was the earnestness of this shepherd in seeking for a poor animal which had probably frozen on the glacier, how is it that I am so indifferent in seeking my own sheep?”

M. Cheyne, says, “As I walked in the fields the thought came over me, with almost overwhelming power, that every one of my flock must soon be in heaven or hell. Oh, how I wished that I had a tongue like thunder, that I might make all hear; or that I had a frame like iron, that I might visit every one and say, escape for thy life! Ah! Sinner, you little know how I fear that you will lay the blame of your damnation at my door!”

THE UNCHANGING CHRIST IN A CHANGING WORLD

Hebrews 7:22-24

INTRODUCTION

IT DOESN'T MAKE ANY DIFFERENCE ???

INTRODUCTION

One of the most common cries of religious people today is “It doesn’t make any difference.” Point out where someone’s doctrine is not in accord with the Bible and he will say, “Well, it doesn’t make any difference.”

To say “it doesn’t make any difference:

- Is to exalt human wisdom and human opinion to the same level as the Word of God.
- It is to say that man’s opinion is as important as the Word of our Lord, and to disregard the Word of the Lord for human opinion.
- Oh how dangerous to declare that there is no difference in the teaching of the Bible and human wisdom.

If it doesn’t make any difference, why did the Lord give us the Bible as our guide?

II Tim3:16-17

If it doesn’t make any difference, then the broad way is broad enough to include all beliefs, even that of the false prophets would leads to heaven.

Mt. 7:13-15

If it doesn’t make any difference, it is all right to preach another gospel.

Gal. 1:8-9; I Cor. 1:10; Jn. 17:20-21

If it doesn't make any difference, it is all right to add to or take from the Word.

Rev. 22:18-19

If it doesn't make any difference, it is all right to transgress (go onward) and abide not in the doctrine of Christ.

If it doesn't make any difference, why did the Lord declare that He has all authority as the head of the church?

- No principle is more noble, as there is none more holy than that of true **obedience**, II Cor. 10:5.
- No man doth safely rule but he that hath learned gladly to **obey**, Rom. 5:1.
- It is a vain thought to flee from the work that God appoints us, for the sake of finding a greater blessing, instead of seeking it where alone it is to be found . . . in loving **obedience**, Rom. 6:16.
- Thirty years of our Lord's life are hidden in these words of the gospel: "He was subject unto them," Heb. 5:8.
- **Obedience** is the mother of success and is wedded to safety, Rom. 5:19.
- Let thy child's first lesson be **obedience**, and the second may be what thou wilt, II Tim. 3:15.
- **Obedience** to God is the most infallible evidence of sincere and supreme love to Him, Jn. 14:15.

THE EVIDENCE OF PARDON

INTRODUCTION

Isa. 55:6-7; Acts 3:19— How may we be assured that our sins are pardoned or blotted out?

Heb. 10:22— Our assurance is in the realm of faith, and not a matter of physical knowledge.

I Jn. 5:13— Our knowledge of salvation depends upon the written word.

SHOULD DEPEND UPON GOD'S PROMISES

Mk. 16:15-16; Heb. 5:9; II Pet. 1:4; I Jn. 2:3 — Those who obey these conditions can trust these promises.

Acts 2:38, 22:16; Gal. 3:26-27— Only those who know the truth can know they have come to the point of obedience where God promised to save. Suppose you have sinned against a brother of great character and he offers to forgive you upon certain conditions which you faithfully perform. What would be the evidence that you are forgiven? Your feelings, or his trusted promise?

FEELINGS ARE NO EVIDENCE OF PARDON

Lk. 17:3— A brother can not feel me forgive him. Forgiveness is not an act performed in him, but in my mind for him. Pardon takes place in heaven in God's mind for sinners and not in them, Jer. 31:31-34. Can the criminal in the penitentiary feel the governor pardoning him?

The moral changes which take place IN man are not pardon. These are brought about by the

gospel, Rom. 1:16; Ps. 19:7. Pardon takes place in heaven FOR man. Hence, we cannot feel the act of pardon or forgiveness.

FEELINGS ARE AS DECEPTIVE AS THE TESTIMONY PRODUCING THEM

Lk. 21:8— One feels like he is saved because he already believes he is saved, and the testimony that makes him believe he is saved may not be the truth. Catholics feel that the priest forgives their sins but they are deceived.

Gen. 37:23-35; 45:25-28— The testimony which made Jacob feel for above twenty years that Joseph was dead was false testimony,

Jn. 16:2, Acts 3:17— When deceived, one may feel that he is serving God when committing murder, Acts 26:9-11; Acts 23:1; I Tim. 1:13— While in ignorance and unbelief of the truth, Paul felt right in persecuting Christians. No intelligent person offers his feelings as evidence that he is married, or a Boy Scout, or that he is a Mason, a member of some Fraternity or the Lions Club. The criminal does not argue that he is pardoned because he feels pardoned. Would he feel pardoned if he were given a counterfeit pardon by some deceiver?

THE SPIRIT ITSELF BEARETH WITNESS WITH OUR SPIRIT

Rom. 8:16— Note, it is “with,” not “to” our spirit. There are two witnesses to establish the proposition that I am a child of God.

God’s Spirit bears witness through inspired men and his testimony is on record in the Bible.

➤I must not forsake the assembling of the saints together, under the fear of eternal judgment, Heb. 10:25-31.

➤Which comes first with you, visiting relatives or serving God? When we NEGLECT the Bible classes and worship service of the church week after week to visit friends or relatives we hurt the church and evidence misplaced affection.

➤Young people who have homes of their own need to recognize their responsibility to the local church and place it first. Let us not be babies all our lives, Matt. 10:37

I owe the church my financial support.

➤The project of advancing the kingdom must be financed. It is an expensive operation. The church of the Lord was founded upon sacrifice, Acts 20:28.

Are you bearing your portion of the financial burden of the local church? Are you a spiritual parasite? If you enjoy all the blessings provided by the church and yet do not contribute to its support liberally, you are acting the part of a religious pan-handler.

Try to think of other things you owe the church.

30% FAITH

I am present every Lord's Day, PROVIDED it is nice weather, and I do not have something more important to do.

40% FAITH

My record shows that I attend three out of four Sunday mornings.

50% FAITH

I rarely miss a Sunday morning preaching service. I give as much as the average person.

90% FAITH

I never miss (unless I am sick). I take a leading part. I never criticize adversely, but I suggest how to help. I teach others and I give until it hurts.

100% FAITH

This is the kind none of us have yet. It is the kind that will remove mountains.

TOMORROW

The spirit of *tomorrow* caused the ruin of the foolish virgins, Mt. 25:1-12.

The Christian religion is a daily religion. Heb. 3:13, "But exhort one another daily, while it is called today; lest any of you be hardened through the deceitfulness of sin."

We must prepare and be prepared every day.

With the lepers the grateful and the ungrateful were as one to nine. It is a sad situation. With the saved

sinner, members of the church, proportion of grateful and ungrateful is substantially the same.

The children of Israel had been in bondage for 400 years. God sent plagues on Egypt to convince Pharaoh to let the people go. They were finally released after the tenth plague and Moses led them to the Red Sea.

Ex. 14:10 The Israelites were afraid, sure the Egyptians would kill them.

Ex. 14:13 Moses had no fear. He was convinced God would save them.

Ex. 14:15 God demanded confidence from Moses, then gave him instructions.

The children of Israel were commanded in their perplexing circumstances to *move forward* into the waters of the Red Sea. A soul anxious to go forward will find paths where least expected and in most unlikely places.

IT WAS A TIME OF INACTIVITY

They expected God to work a miracle.

Moses had said, “God will fight for you,”

The people do something—GO, Ex. 14:15 ff.

THERE ARE TIMES WHEN ACTION IS MORE NEEDFUL THAN PRAYER

Moses had been praying and God told said,

“Wherefore criest thou unto me?”

Prayer without action will not remove physical disease, will not improve social position, will not broaden education, will not strengthen character. Men must go forward as well as pray.

IT WAS A TESTING TIME

How unusual was God's command to Moses?

It is the job of every preacher to encourage God's people to GO FORWARD.

GO FORWARD

with the elders wishes regarding service times.

GO FORWARD

with the work of the church.

GO FORWARD

with your obligations as an individual Christian.

GO FORWARD

with your responsibilities in your family.

IT WAS A TIME OF CRISIS

Defeat or victory lay in their hands.

God had a purpose for His people and He baptized them in the sea.

IT WAS A TIME OF VICTORY

This message is needed in our day.

We must GO FORWARD.

PAUL'S INDEBTEDNESS

Romans 1:14

To whom was Paul in debt?

The Greeks. They were considered Barbarians. A Barbarian was a foreigner whose language another didn't understand. The whole class to whom he was in debt is divided into the wise and unwise, the ignorant and the learned.

WHAT WAS THE GROUND OF HIS INDEBTEDNESS?

Not what he had received from the Gentiles. See him at Rome and Philippi, also II Cor. 11:24-28. But rather what he had received from God.

His being

His physical powers

His intellectual powers

His Moral or spiritual power, Acts 17:25-28

His deliverance from sin, Col. 1:13

His call to the ministry, Acts 26:16

The gospel, Gal. 1:12

Paul received these things for others and not for himself alone, I Tim. 1:11-12. Paul felt an obligation because of this indebtedness, Acts 17:16; I Cor. 9:16. He owed the gospel to them, Rom. 1:16.

WE ARE IN DEBT FOR THE SAME PURPOSE

Powers, capacities, and opportunities God has given us place us in debt. As members of the church we are the receptacle of the truth for others,

Accountability is measured by ability. Ability consists of all those powers, capacities, and opportunities, whether physical, intellectual, or moral, with which God has blessed us.

The means and opportunities for spreading the gospel are truly wonderful. These only increase debt. This obligation must be discharged in this life or never.

DEACONS

THE MEANING OF THE TERM DEACON

Deacon means waiter, attendant, servant, minister. It is derived from the word “DIAKO” which means to run or hasten. The fundamental idea of the word DEACON is active service.

In this general sense the meaning of DEACON includes—

Evangelist or Minister, Eph. 6:21; Col. 1:7; I Tim. 4:6; Jn. 12:26

In a special sense the word DEACON—

The word DEACON can be used in an official sense to indicate the office of a deacon, Phil. 1:1; I Tim. 3:8-13.

The position and work of a DEACON—

The DEACON is a helper, servant or minister of the church. This contrasts with the BISHOP which is an OVERSEER. The DEACON works under the oversight of Elders (Bishops).

Acts 6:1-6 From this passage we observe—

These men were selected to relieve the apostles of secular duties and responsibilities in order that they might give more fully to spiritual matters. These men were selected by the congregation and then appointed by the apostles.

The performance of the work for which they were selected constituted the full measure of special responsibility.

Their qualifications, I Timothy 3:8-13 —

Grave, not double tongued, not given to much wine, not greedy for money, holding the faith in a pure conscience, proved, husband of one wife, and ruling their children and homes well, Acts 6:1-6; Gal. 5:22-24.

The early church had all things common. They didn't have social organizations to take care of widows and poor brethren. When a Jew became a Christian they often lost all ties with their family. They were no longer helped financially from the Synagogue. The church had to step in and help, Acts 2:44-45.

As blessed as Christians are today it becomes a moral question when a widow is neglected. It becomes a moral question when an evangelistic work has to stop from lack of funds.

SOWING DISCORD

Proverbs 6:14

God's plan is for His people to live in peace. This can only be possible if we follow "after the same rule" and endeavor to keep unity "in the bonds of peace."

David gives us a great truth in Psalm 133—
"Behold, how good and how pleasant it is for
brethren to dwell together in unity!"

Many brethren are not satisfied unless they are stirring up strife. The government term for this type of secretive activity is "Fifth Column."

A "Fifth Column" is a group of people which clandestinely undermines a larger group to which it is expected to be loyal, such as a nation. The term originated with a 1936 radio address by Emilio Mola, a Nationalist general during the 1936-39 Spanish Civil War. As four of his army columns moved on Madrid, the general referred to his militant supporters within the capital as his "fifth column," intent on undermining the Republican government from within. The term is also used in reference to a population who are assumed to have loyalties to countries other than the one in which they reside, or who support some other nation in war efforts against the country they live in.

THE SOWER

A Malignant person

Delights in sowing discord. He is a true child of Satan. Remember how Satan maligned God in the Garden Of Eden? “Ye shall not surely die: for God doth know that in the day ye eat thereof, then your eyes shall be opened, and ye shall be as gods, knowing good and evil.” Also, remember how he maligned Job when he said, “Doth Job fear God for nothing? Hast not thou made an hedge about him, and about his house, and about all that he hath on every side? . . . but put forth thine hand now, and touch all that he hath, and he will curse thee to thy face.”

An Egotistic Person

A prideful person puts himself before God, Psa. 10:4. He seeks preeminence above all else, III Jn. 1:9. He is just one person but he is like a pebble thrown into a peaceful lake that causes a disturbing wave to every shore. This kind of person has no regard for the rights of others. He will lead an entire congregation into confusion.

An Ignorant Person

An Ignorant person is not known for well doing but rather for their foolishness, I Pet. 2:15. They enjoy the vanity of blind ignorance, Eph. 4:17-18. Their ignorance is their most precious possession for they use it as an excuse, Acts 17:30. By ignorance their pride is increased, they always usurp who know least. Self-conceit sets their pedestal too high. They mind other people’s business because they are too lazy to mind their own.

A Heedless Person

A heedless person is easy to deceive, Lk. 21:8. They are into sin before they are aware of it, Lk. 21:34. And worst of all they use their liberty in Christ as maliciousness or as a stumbling block to them that are weak, I Cor. 8:9; I Pet. 2:16.

THE SEED

A Misrepresentation

A lie. If we are only pretending to be faithful then we are misrepresenting, lying, and hypocritical, I Jn. 1:6. Just a little misrepresentation, just a little lie, is not of the truth and therefore not of God, I Jn. 2:21.

A HOT Word

If we approach a troublesome question calmly we might see a way of avoiding a quarrel. When this isn't done opposition is magnified, Col. 3:12.

An Unkind Word

Guard your attitude for it will affect your speech. Whether an unkind word is deliberate or just slipped out it will cause problems, II Pet. 1:7.

THE SOIL

Weedy Soil

The good seed is growing in a Christian's heart but he must keep the weeds down! He must keep his "inward part" free of wickedness, Psalms 5:9. He must weed out cursing, deceit and fraud, Psalms 10:7; James 1:26.

A Fruitful Soil

He must not have soil that produces corrupt fruit, Mt. 12:33.

THE HARVEST

Is Painful

Pride may conceal the wound but the sore is not slight. No misery is greater than that of family disturbances.

Is Injurious

It raises evil passions, hinders harmonious actions, and wastes resources.

Is Un-Christian

It is the opposite of how a Christian should behave, Gal. 5:22; Psa. 133; Mt. 5:9, Eph. 4
