
Archeological Evidence

There is an interesting theory concerning the age of people in the Patriarchal Age. It suggests the world was so changed by the flood that it resulted in people living shorter and shorter lives.


The book *The Genesis Flood* puts forth this theory using thought provoking Archeological persuasion.


Daniel lived and served under these kings of Babylon:
